Main Activity: Making Land Art

1. Click on the Land Art Inspiration Slideshow below to see cool examples of land art.



2. Explore your yard or ask an adult if you can walk around your neighborhood

to find leaves, rocks, sticks, flowers, whatever pieces of nature you want to use in your art. **Remember:** *Only pick up pieces of nature that have fallen on the ground. Don't pick any flowers or break off branches or leaves from trees.*

3. Create a beautiful piece of art using the nature you found. This art can look however you want!

5. Remember, because this art is made out of nature, it is not meant to last forever.

Challenges:

Challenge 1: Build a Fairy or Gnome Home

Challenge 2: Tower or Sculpture

For this challenge, you are going to try to design a tower or sculpture like Andy Goldsworthy. Try stacking rocks on top of each other or building a structure using sticks and logs.
