



Imago COVID Policies As of February 3rd, 2021

Imago is committed to offering a fun, safe camp experience. In order to do so, we have created a set of COVID-19 related policies. Imago's COVID policies are in place to do our part to stop or minimize the spread of the coronavirus and to maximize the safety of our campers, their families, and our staff. **Our policies have been developed using the best practices and guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and the State of Ohio Department of Health and reflect the most up-to-date recommendations and procedures that are currently available.**

Please note that these policies may change as updated or new guidelines are provided by the CDC or the state of Ohio.

Before the Camp Day Begins

- We ask that campers who are showing symptoms of COVID-19 or have a fever of 100 degrees or greater are kept at home.
 - Cough
 - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
 - Fever
 - Chills
 - Muscle pain
 - Sore throat
 - New loss of taste or smell
- Campers who have come into close daily contact with a person who has tested positive for COVID-19 will also be asked to remain home
- Campers should limit the use of personal items from home during the camp day. Backpacks and other personal items will be stored away in a personal bin.

Camp Drop Off

- Parent and child will be asked to wear a mask while their child is being dropped off
- Campers will be asked to participate in a simple daily health screening. As part of the screening, campers' temperatures will be taken by an Imago staff with a non-contact thermometer. A camper with a temperature of 100 degrees or higher will be unable to participate in the camp day
- Additionally, in line with Ohio mandated regulations, a child who has been in close daily contact with someone exhibiting the following symptoms will be asked to stay at home
 - Cough
 - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
 - Fever
 - Chills
 - Muscle pain
 - Sore throat
 - New loss of taste or smell



During the Camp Day

- Campers and staff will be asked to wear masks throughout the camp day, and masks will be required when maintaining a distance of six feet apart is not possible.
- To stem the possible spread of the virus, the use of shared materials will be minimized. Any materials that are shared, will be sanitized regularly and between uses.
- Imago staff will perform regular sanitation of materials and spaces during the camp day.
- Campers and staff will increase handwashing times including after activities, before and after eating and going to the bathroom, before going home, and regularly throughout the day.
- Campers' backpacks and other personal items brought to camp will be stored in a personal bin to minimize possible cross-contamination.

Illness During the Camp Day

- Should a camper become sick during the course of a camp day, they will be given their own space to isolate, in clear view, and in contact with an Imago staff member.
- Parents will be asked to pick up their child in an efficient and timely manner should they become sick during the camp day

Camper Pick Up

- We ask that parents not come to the camp building to pick up a camper. If a camper needs to be picked up early, we ask that you let Imago staff know ahead of time and that you contact our staff when you arrive at Imago and we will escort your camper out to you.

After the Camp Day

- Imago staff will sanitize all camp spaces and camp materials used each day after camp ends.

Sudden Cancellation and Refund Policy

Families should be aware that there are situations out of Imago's control that may close camp for a day, a week, or more. Those situations include a confirmed positive case of COVID-19 in a camper, staff, or members of their household. This could also include an order to close from the State of Ohio. In the event of a camp closing, or a possible closing, Imago will communicate with you as quickly as possible about any changes in the status of the camp.
